**Please:**

1. Copy this flyer and give it to each of your scouts and to your adult committee.
2. Inform your scouts that they **MUST** call the counselor immediately after they have read the requirements in the merit badge pamphlet of their choice.
3. Counselors have the right to refuse admission to any scout who has not called and prepared properly.
4. **Furnish your scouts with a blue merit badge application card (the blue application paper form is fine). They must bring this card to Merit Badge Day filled out and signed by you.**
5. Make sure your scouts are prepared for the merit badges before coming to Merit Badge Day.
6. Remind your scouts to wear their **FULL UNIFORM** to Merit Badge Day, as this is **required**.

***CAMOUFLAGE, SWEATS AND T-SHIRTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE AND SCOUTS WILL BE SENT HOME. COMPLETE UNIFORMS ONLY.***





### Scout Notes:


**SCOUTS**, in order to have a smooth running, successful day for you, we need your help! **PLEASE:**

1. Choose a merit badge from the available classes. Make note of classes that take two sessions
2. **Read the MOST RECENT edition pamphlet of the merit badge(s) of your choice then:**
  - a. **CALL THE COUNSELOR IMMEDIATELY!** There are requirements for each merit badge that **must** be completed by you **before** Merit Badge Day. Ask the counselor questions about prerequisites and any equipment, notebooks, pens or pencils, etc. you need to bring.
3. **Do the prerequisites and bring the pamphlet** (Merit Badge book) with you to Merit Badge Day.
4. **Bring a Merit Badge Application Card (or blue application paper form is OK) signed by your Scoutmaster. General rule is no signature on the blue card, no admittance into the class.**
5. You **MUST BE IN FULL UNIFORM OR YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN CLASS.**
6. Bring a sack lunch or **\$3.00** each to buy your lunch (see announcement below).
7. Bring change for a phone call if you need to make one.
8. Remember: Classes close after the first 15 minutes

Class sized will be limited. Bring paper, pen or pencil, a 32 gallon trash bag, a cardboard box, scissors, an old spoon, and an old paint brush between 1-2 inches wide.</li> <li>2. Requirement #4-A&amp;B, Learn about (2) Archaeology sites (one outside and one within the USA). Be prepared to find both sites on a world map and give an explanation of their importance to modern people.</li> <li>3. For requirement #5, the scout will present/report to the Merit Badge group, about one of the above places/sites.</li> <li>4. Requirement #7-A or B. Fill in all answers in worksheet for 2A, 2B, 2C - write a report on your family meeting and discuss in your report their responses and show your family chart.</li> <li>Req. 3. Fill in answers for 3A, 3B, 3C and 3D: bring any items or equipment to show and demonstrate the above situations</li> <li>Req. 4. Explain in worksheet and bring items needed to demonstrate how to signal a aircraft in three different ways.</li> <li>Req. 5. Explain in worksheet and prepare to participate in class demonstrating with other scouts how to transport and injured scout by methods taught in scout handbook.</li> <li>Req.6. Explain in worksheet for 6A on 1 to 4, 6B and 6C: prepare to discuss information to class and explain how it can be applied to chart you created for req. 2B.</li> <li>Req. 7: Bring written proof from your unit leader.</li> <li>Req. 8       <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>8A: Bring written plan and prepare to explain in class</li> <li>8B: Bring written proof from unit leader for troop mobilization exercise. All reports to be in detail. Six to eight words is not sufficient or will not be expected for an answer. 	<p>Merit Badge Prerequisite requirements for <b>Coin Collecting</b>: (Read the Merit Badge pamphlet)</p> <p><b>#Six-</b> Collect and show your counselor <b>five</b> different <b>quarters</b> you have acquired from circulation from the 1999-2008 50 State Quarters Program.</p> <p><b>#Seven-</b> Collect from circulation a <u>set</u> of currently circulating U.S. coins. Include <b>one coin of each denomination</b> (cent, nickel, dime, quarter, half-dollar, and a dollar coin). For each coin, locate the mint marks, if any, and the designer's initials, if any.</p> <p><b>#Nine-</b> Do any <u>one</u> of <b>#Nine, either A, B, C, or D</b>. Bring the items with you. (Note: If you do NOT have a coin collection, then 9-D is easiest, but remember it is a SET of the <b><u>SAME</u></b> denomination of coin, NOT a mixture! )</p> <p><b>#Ten-D</b> Do <b>drawings of FIVE Colonial-era U.S. coins (Coins made before 1776)</b>. Draw the <u>FRONT</u> and the <u>BACK</u> of the coins. Bring the <b>TEN</b> drawings.
